Open to vocalists and instrumentalists who are 11th or 12th grade students studying with a current, active member of the Glendale Branch of the Music Teachers' Association

The following scholarship amounts are available this year

Grand Prize Awards

Keyboard: \$700.00 Wind/Voice: \$700.00

Joseph and Laura DiTullio String Award: \$700.00 plus as many as 9 additional Scholarship Awards \$450.00 (any category).

Encouragement Awards \$100.00 (any category)

Audition Date: Sunday, April 3, 2022

Audition Location: TBA

Application Deadline March 3rd 2022 (Online application)

Application Fee: \$35.00 (non-refundable)

Repertoire Requirements:

All applicants must present two memorized solo selections, choosing one from each of the following two categories:

1. Baroque Period or Classical Period
2. Romantic/Impressionistic Period or Contemporary Period

Concerti are not acceptable for piano; instrumentalists may perform only one movement from one concerto. Popular music is not acceptable. Maximum audition time for each applicant will not exceed 15 minutes. At the discretion of the judges, students may be asked to move to the next piece or be stopped.

Requirements for All Applicants:

1. Must be in the 11th or 12th grade.
2. Must have studied with a Glendale Branch MTAC member since Jan. 1, 2021 and must be recommended by their teacher. Verification may be requested. Include names of previous teachers and dates of study.
3. Must have participated in at least one Branch activity (including Certificate of Merit and VOCE) since January 1, 2021. EVERY STUDENT MUST INCLUDE PDF OF PROGRAM WITH APPLICATION.
4. Must submit school transcripts verifying they have been in American Schools since the 9th grade.
5. All winners, including Scholarship Award winners, must attend Awards Evening in order to receive their awards.
6. Grand Prize winners must agree to perform at Awards Evening in order to receive their awards.

An 11th grade student who wins Grand Prize will not be eligible to compete the following year. All scholarship amounts will be awarded at the discretion of the judges. The decision of the judges is final.
